

PARENT TIPS

Play

As older kids return to school we get the opportunity to focus on our younger kids during the day! If screen time is a part of your family's play consider using websites like PBS Kids, an app with a focus on young children!



Bonding

For our young children so much of our bonding comes through physical contact. Cuddling and hugging your child is good for you and baby! Consider reading a book while cuddling for encouraging development and helping baby relax with the sound of your voice!

Social Emotional



Technology has definitely changed the way we can encourage social and emotional skills. Using phones or screens to video chat with family or friends who are not regularly seen is a good way to encourage relationships.



Safety

Forour youngest kids screen time is typically pretty limited, but like with any child using a screen, you want to make sure that the content being viewed is age appropriate and has the same values that you encourage in your family.



Development

For children under a year old, it is recommended to have as little screen time as possible. But screen time is a tool that helps many parents, so when picking a program that encourages learning, content that introduces numbers and letters is appealing at this age.



PARENT TIPS

Play

At this age, our children are making new friends and expanding the group of kids they are making friends from. Encourage safe, inclusive play by modeling it at home: giving everyone a turn, showing that you respect your child's boundaries, and using kind words! And at this age, kids are starting to play with computer games. Before allowing them to play a new game, check to make sure it meets your family's values!



Bonding

Our child being in school gives us an opportunity not only to bond with them, but also to show the importance of learning. Have a set time to check in about their day, complete any homework, and share anything that is coming up the following day. This shows our children that we care about their lives and their education, which always leads to a solid bond!
